Last week, Kindergarteners went on a Mystery Trip to Taylor Creek near Lake Tahoe to kick off their case study about salmon life cycles, habitat, and stewardship.

They didn't know where they were going until they worked together with their field crews to solve the mystery! Then they visited several stations run by our amazing parent volunteers to learn about each stage of the salmon's life cycle and what they need to survive and thrive.

At each station they collected a "puzzle piece" to complete

their field guides, which we will refer back to as we deepen our learning in the classroom.

All along the way, students observed the spawning kokanee salmon, their redds (nests), and "zombie fish," or the fish at the end of their life cycle. (Continued pg 2)


An Expanded View of Student Achievement
